

TERTIARY SUPPORT PROGRAM GUIDELINES

About the Bass Coast Community Foundation

The Bass Coast Community Foundation (BCCF) exists to make a positive difference in people's lives within the Bass Coast region. We achieve this by seeking donations from individuals, families and businesses to contribute to a permanent fund specifically for the benefit of local people and projects. A percentage of this fund is allocated annually to address local needs, with the remaining funds invested long term as a permanent community asset.

Our Community Foundation is one of over fifty Community Foundations operating around Australia. We are a registered charity, defined by the boundaries of the Bass Coast Shire in South Eastern Victoria. We are governed by a board of voluntary directors, all of whom live locally and have an extensive knowledge of the local community and its unique and diverse needs.

Since establishment in 2002, our Foundation has assisted projects which benefit local youth, the aged, and promote community wellbeing. We are committed to working in partnership with community members and organisations to strengthen and enrich local life through effective giving.

What is the Tertiary Support Program?

The Tertiary Support Program was established to encourage the uptake and completion of tertiary studies by Bass Coast students. The program recognises that students need financial and social support, as well as course and career guidance, in order to give them every opportunity to complete a course at tertiary level.

The program offers awards of \$4000 per year for students undertaking the Second Year of study at a recognised Australian tertiary institution. Subject to successful completion of Second Year, a further award of \$4,000 is made for Third Year. Recipients are also matched with a mentor who will provide support for them through up to two years of study.

Who can apply?

- Residents of the Bass Coast Shire
- Students who have moved away (or will move away) from the Bass Coast region in order to study
- Students enrolled (or who are intending to enrol) in the Second Year of a course of study at a recognised Australian Tertiary Institution in the following calendar year.

What can the award be used for?

This can be negotiated with the Bass Coast Community Foundation, but would be specifically relevant for the following:

- Accommodation expenses
- Related living expenses
- Books and other course related supplies
- Equipment required for study purposes (e.g. computer, specialised tools, protective clothing).

How do I apply?

Applicants must complete the Bass Coast Community Foundation Tertiary Support Application Form and attach a letter of reference, addressing the identified information from your nominated school/University based referee. Additional references will also be accepted.

Applicants are welcome to discuss their application with the Bass Coast Community Foundation Executive Officer if they want to ensure they meet the eligibility requirements.

Application Assessment Process

Award applications will be evaluated by an advisory committee appointed by the Board of the Bass Coast Community Foundation. The final decision will rest with the Board of Directors.

To ensure that informed decisions are made, on occasions, applicants may be requested to provide further information. The timing of decisions will be dependent on Board meetings.

All award applicants will be notified of the outcome of their application by mail. Successful applicants will be advertised on the Foundation's website and Facebook page, as well as in the local media.

Successful applicants will be required to provide proof of enrolment prior to payments being made, and will be required to sign the conditions of the award program.
